Lord, help us to look for opportunities to give practical support to those in need of it, both physically and emotionally. May we do so sensitively, always trying to follow your example in all we do and say.

We ask, Lord that we may make a positive and thoughtful contribution to debates which can become polarised and confrontational. Help us to guard against the temptation to over simplify complex issues and to listen with respect to those whose views are different from our own.

Almighty God, we continue to marvel at the thought that you, who created all that is, care for each one of us and have granted us the privilege of being partners in the work of your Kingdom.

Holy Spirit, we often feel powerless as news of disease, crime, oppression and abuse of all kinds and in all parts of the world reaches us daily. Remind us that we have the power of prayer.

There are so many things, Lord, which we want to pray for; for the disruption to lives brought about by Covid 19, for the people desperate enough to cross the Channel in small boats, for the workers in low-paid jobs who deserve more respect and money, for those who are hungry, cold and lonely, for those for whom Christmas is a time of painful memories, and along with all of these things and more, our prayers of thanksgiving for the blessings we enjoy. Help us this year and every year to devote time to deepen our relationship with you through prayer.
